






YOUTH AND THE COMMUNITY


Youth demonstrate amazing optimism; the majority feel they are in charge of their destiny. At the same time, 58% say they are influenced by their families (28% by mothers), and over half rely on their community for support in life. Yet, more than a quarter are exposed to violence, substance abuse and other risky behaviors by either family or community.
